### **How does a practice benefit from an EHR?**

The benefits of installing an EHR system include:  
Greater administrative efficiency  
Improvement in documentation quality  
Enhancing patient communication and medication management  
Saves time by reducing chart pulls and filing



### **What does the eClinicalWorks EHR system offer?**

eClinicalWorks' integrated EHR system includes practice management features—scheduling, billing, electronic charting, e-prescribing, point-of-care electronic alerts/reminders that incorporate clinical guidelines—and a patient portal. eClinicalWorks also provides on-site training and technical support during implementation, migrates data from your existing practice management system to theirs, and offers you two years of system maintenance and upgrades (valued at \$1,800 per provider) and two years of 24-hour telephone and online support (valued at approximately \$1,200 per provider).

### **How does the DOHMH Partnership work?**

Your practice would make both cash and in-kind contributions per provider. For a one-time fee of \$4,000 per full-time health care provider, the practice will receive system maintenance and support services for two years at no additional cost. After two years, the annual cost for ongoing maintenance and support of system software would be approximately \$1,500. The in-kind, non-cash, contribution would include time set aside for your office to attend software training sessions, purchases of computer and network hardware, and budgetary allowances for reduced scheduling during implementation.

**Multiple studies have shown that *unsubsidized* EHRs pay for themselves within two to three years on average.** Through a subsidized program like the PCIP, there is a quicker return on investment.
